


Dear Parents / Carers,

Welcome back to our Year 8,9 and 10 and for the very first time Year 11 parents. Also a very warm welcome to our new Year 7 parents. It always makes me feel proud to see the students coming back through the gates at the beginning of term. It is a time for fresh faces, fresh uniforms and fresh starts.

I am pleased to say that our Year 7s have settled in even quicker than normal, thanks to so many of you taking up the extra transition activities last year. The students seem confident with staff and around the school and are already building firm friendships. Well done Year 7!

As we continue our development to an 11-16 school, we are now focussed on the '5 year journey'. With most of



our students now being part of the school for the full 5 years covering all of their KS3 and KS4 education, it is more important than ever for us to be working together and nurturing the supportive and collaborative relationships between staff, parents and students.

We have made a small changes to our Ivanhoe Way this year to acknowledge our move to 11-16. We have changed "succeed" to "achieve". We still remain very

focussed on the education of the whole child', but our aim as educators should always be for students to achieve the best they can, and we will support them to do this.

As part of the LPPA Award (Leading Parent Partnership) which we achieved at the end of last year, and in response to your feedback we will be looking at new ways to involve parents and carers in the life of the school, and to take part in joint learning activities with your child, such as the first aid training we ran last year. We are excited at this new initiative for Ivanhoe.

We are just finalising our school clubs and sports practices and these will be released as soon as possible. Please encourage your child to try something, even if it is something brand new to them.

Arbor – Our Communication App

We know some parents have had a few difficulties logging into our Parent Portal/ Arbor App. Every parent has an account set up for you.



To finish creating your account you just need to set a password. Your username is the email address you have given to school. Go to https://login.arbor.sc and click 'Forgot your password?' to finish setting up your account.

The Arbor App can be downloaded from either the Play Store on android phones or the Apple Store on iPhones. Please note you will not be able to log into the app until you have followed the instructions above to set up your account.

School Meals

As you know, this year we have made the decision to move to a slightly shorter lunch time, this brings us in line with many schools in the area. As part of the introduction we have allowed Year 7s to come out of lessons a little earlier for lunch to allow them to get used to the lunch routines.



Slight delays in serving this week has been caused by a proportion of parents not adding money to their child's wisepay account, which

created additional admin jobs for our catering staff to record the meals each child had. However going forward we are confident this issue will be resolved.

As per our communication last year, please note that a meal deal now costs £3 (click here for further information), so please ensure that your child has adequate funds on their account. Please also talk to your child about their daily limits for spending, as some students are spending at break and not leaving adequate funds for what they want to buy at lunch, again causing delays. If your child is entitled to free school meals, they will receive a £3 daily limit, which can be spent at break or lunchtime. This is reset every day.

Assessment

All students will be having some initial tests over the first few weeks. Reading, spelling tests and CATs (Cognitive Ability Tests) primarily.
