## **Dear Parents and Carers**,

A few more updates below:

### **Mobile Phones in School**

At Ivanhoe we appreciate that phones are a way of life for all of us, and in particular, for those students who travel a way to school, the peace of mind having a phone brings is invaluable. However, they have been causing some disruption and distractions during the school day, and so we have re-informed our students this week about behaviour expectations, but also sanctions they can expect if they do not follow instructions.

As has always been the case:

- Students are expected to have phones turned off and out of sight during the whole school day this includes breaks and lunchtimes
- Students should not be using personal devices to contact home, they should be going to reception if they have an issue which requires parents to be contacted.
- Other smart devices such as apple watches are not allowed at school



#### Going forward:

- 1. If a phone is used, seen or heard by a teacher in a lesson, students will be asked to put their phone on the teacher's desk until the end of lesson and a C1 consequence issued.
- 2. If a student is using a phone during break/lunch or transition times they will be told to put it away and a C1 consequence given.
- 3. If students refuse either of the above their phone will be confiscated for the rest of the day and will need to be collected form reception at 3.05pm. A C3 consequence will be given.

If a student has their phone confiscated twice in a half term they will be asked to leave it at home/or hand in everyday for the remainder of that half term.

We hope that our parents will support us in the enforcing of this expectation, which is in line with the Department for Education Guidance.


