School Bus Passes – All current and new students must complete a new application form.



We have been asked to share with all parents and carers a change to the school busses for 2024/25.

All transport routes to Ivanhoe and Ashby School have been awarded by the Local Authority to Passenger Travel Services (Roberts) for next year 2024/25.

Passes will no longer be issued by the LEA so everyone must apply directly for a pass with Passenger Travel Services (Roberts). This applies to all year groups currently at Ivanhoe, new year 7s and for students moving from Ivanhoe to Ashby at the end of Year 9 or Year 11. All students, free and fare paying, must complete an

application, so that the new company has your up to date details.

We would like to introduce you to Noodle, our new school dog. Noodle is a miniature Australian Labradoodle puppy who lives with Mrs Johnson, Our Lead Practitioner of SEND. Noodle will be spending time in school over the next few months and she will slowly be introduced to school life as she grows. Noodle won't be ready to interact with students until her basic training and socialisation has been completed but we hope Noodle will join staff on gate duty towards the end of the summer term.

Studies have shown there are numerous benefits to having a school pet,

the presence of a school dog can improve the well-being of students and lower anxiety levels, simply by making the environment happier and more enjoyable. A school dog

offers students the opportunity to positively interact with, and learn how to take care of, an animal in a controlled environment. Our school dog, Noodle has been chosen as she has a calm and nurturing temperament.





We understand that some parents/ carers may be concerned about possible allergic reactions to a school dog, although Noodle is known to be a low shedding breed, we have taken into account children who have disclosed to us an allergy to dogs and students will only work with her if they voluntarily wish to. Please inform Mrs Johnson if you do not wish your child to interact with Noodle. Mrs Johnson has secured special school dog insurance and Noodle's vaccination record/ vet checks will be updated regularly and a copy kept in

school. Noodle will not be allowed in school if she is unwell and all students working with her will be briefed about hygiene around animals and encouraged to wash their hands before and after coming into contact with Noodle.





Noodle can't wait to meet you all and we hope you're as excited as we are to watch her grow and develop.
