Arbor Communication App

The Arbor App can be downloaded from either the Play Store on android phones or the Apple Store on iPhones. Please note you will not be able to log into the app until you have followed the instructions above to set up your account.

Assessments

All students will be having some initial tests over the first few weeks. Reading, spelling tests and CATs (Cognitive Ability Tests) primarily. Homework Assignments - How do I know what my child has been set?

In recent years many schools have moved to an online system for communicating with parents and students about homework set. We know from parental feedback that many of you would like to have this as it will help you have a better overview of what is being set and when it's is due in to help manage, support and monitor your child's homework.

This year we will be notifying both students and parents of homework assignments though our online school system – Arbor

Students can also make a note of homework in their notebooks.

I know many of you already have the app, if not you can download from your usual app store or log on to the web version through your usual browser.

Here is an explanation video of how it works. Please watch this so you can understand how it works and let me know if you have any questions. <u>For parents</u>

Students do not have an app, they will need to log on to the web version with their own details not the parent's.

We will be showing students how to do this in detail in form time next week. If they want to get ahead they here is the link to student instructions you can share with them. For students


We will suggest they book mark the page on their devices.

Attendance

Our ethos is that school is a good place to be, and we've embedded that in our attendance strategy by committing to provide an environment where all pupils feel valued and welcome. Our parents and students play a huge part in making our school successful and ensuring that every child has a right to access the education to which he/she is entitled.



Parents and teachers share the responsibility for supporting and promoting excellent school attendance and punctuality for all.

WHY ATTENDANCE IS IMPORTANT

INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Regular attendance is crucial for academic success. Here are some reasons why you should make sure your child is in school every day.

BETTER EDUCATION AND GRADES

Students who miss school miss lectures, notes, class discussions, assignments, quizzes, and tests. Even if they miss just a few days here and there, their grades are likely to suffer.

MORE EFFECTIVE LEARNING

When students are in class, they learn the material along with their classmates. When they're not in class, they have to learn the material on their own, which is time-consuming, stressful, and a much less effective way to learn.

ABLE TO STAY ON TRACK

Chronic absenteeism is a leading indicator that a student will drop out of high school and not graduate. Students who are chronically absent can also get so far behind that they are unable to graduate on time with their classmates.

MORE VALUE ON EDUCATION

When students know that they're expected to be in school every day, they get the message that school and education are important. There is a reason that attendance is at the heart of the Ivanhoe Way. Any absence (including lateness) affects the pattern of a child's schooling and regular absence will seriously affect their school experience, including their attainment, wellbeing, and wider life chances. Any student's absence disrupts teaching routines so may affect the learning of others in the same class.

At Ivanhoe we want our students to achieve their dreams! Students with low attendance are less likely to achieve the GCSE grades they need to successfully move on to their preferred Post 16 choices. We must again draw parents attention again to changes to penalty notice fines for unathorised absences. You will see that the fines and other sanctions are increasing massively.

As a school we do not impose fines, nor do we receive any of the proceeds from the fines. However, we do have a legal obligation to report our attendance and absences to the local authority.



We try to publish our term dates clearly and as early as possible to allow parents to avoid such fines when booking holidays. Please familiarise yourselves with the <u>dates on our website</u>.



The School Day

Students should be onsite no later than 8.30am to avoid the chance of a late mark. We run a 2-week timetable, Week A and B. Please check your child's timetable in their print out or on Arbor. Students should wear PE kit on their PE days. This may be different each week.

Following our successful trial of whole school breaktimes last year, we will now be returning to whole school lunch as well.

There will be an early and late sitting for lunch to reduce queuing, and the year groups will rotate on a fortnightly basis (considering our 2 week menu)

In addition, we have listened to our student council who asked for another selling point for quick grab items (such as drinks and snacks) for students not wanting to purchase a full lunch.

No Drop Off or Pick Up on School Site

Thank you to the majority of parents who have been using the library carpark as a drop off and pick up spot. There are still some parents (about 20) who are attempting to drive on to school site in the morning to drop off their children. This is a safety and space issue. We have 6 buses which need to drive into the site and download the student passengers so there is simply not enough space for parent cars. Duty staff in the morning will be redirecting parents from Monday to alternative drop off points. Thank you for your cooperation with this important safety message.

Lunchtimes

Students were very this week as we had some snagging issues with our new single lunch. On Thursday, there was an unexpected issue with biometric payment system on the first day for year 7s which meant all student orders had to be manually recorded. All students, in all years, were given additional time for eating and no consequences were given for any students late to lesson 4. This has now been resolved.

Noodle

The Friday duty team received a helping hand from our very own Noodle the School Doodle today. Noodle joined Ivanhoe as part of the team back in May but wasn't quite big enough to spend time with our students outside at break and lunch. She is now four months old and has settled brilliantly into school life, so today, she joined our team on bus duty, had a wander around at break and then enjoyed some cuddles and lots of attention during our lunch break.





Students were incredibly enthusiastic to interact with her but very respectful of her boundaries and ensured

that she didn't feel overwhelmed by so many new and friendly faces. She even managed to squeeze time in for a quick nap in the Learning Zone after lunch!

I am sure Noodle will be back on duty in the very near future so make sure you keep an
