Coaching, Reflection, Enrichment and Wellbeing Sessions


Over the first two lessons, students have been learning 'All About Me'. They have been introduced to the Japanese concept of 'Ikigai' (Ikigai is a Japanese concept blending passion, talent, purpose, and fulfilment) learning about student agency and creating a profile delving into information 'All About Me'.

Over the past three lessons, students have been developing a Poem 'All About Me'; these poems were beautiful and a wonderful reflection of the students' sense of self. Ivanhoe students have produced some excellent work that you can see in the pictures here. They have also been getting used to marking their work against new rubrics and learning how to develop and improve their work independently and in pairs. We also looked into an African philosophy called Ubantu. Ubuntu puts forward the idea that we are all connected with each other in different ways. This philosophy encourages us to value our shared bonds and put aside petty arguments and divisions.

These lessons are designed to build student agency and independence that will get them in the right mindset and give them valuable skills to give them the best possible opportunities when they get to their GSCE exams and beyond.

Today schools across Europe celebrated the European Day of Languages, an initiative to celebrate linguistic diversity and promote language learning. To mark the occasion, students participated in an inter-house competition, taking part in a fun quiz during form time. Winning form to be revealed next week! Throughout the week, our languages classes have been buzzing with discussions about the importance of languages in a globalised world, and students have engaged in a variety of language-related activities to deepen their understanding and appreciation of different cultures. Years 7 and 8 students also showed off their quick thinking in a lunchtime French sudoku competition.





At Ivanhoe, we have embraced European Day of languages in Food and Nutrition this week by developing student's awareness of dishes from European countries. Some exciting cross curricular links have been forged between food and MFL during this week which has culminated in students across all year groups making a European dish or watching a demonstration of food being made from European countries.

This week we have made tarte tatin, croque monsieur, patatas bravas, Spanish tortilla, Spanish savoury rice, fruit clafoutis and potato dauphinoise as well as Bruschetta! Below is a selection of the results. It has been a great opportunity for students to discuss different dishes that they may have tried on holiday and to discuss the origins of different ingredients. 







Year 7 Science Space Project

Arbor

Arbor is the system that we use for communications, and setting homework, as well as taking the register and issuing house points in lessons.

• Arbor for parents


As a parent, you can access Arbor online, or download the app. These will allow you to view your child's timetable, attendance, house points and consequences, as well as any homework that they have been set. • Arbor for students

- Students can access Arbor to view the same types of information, either by going through Moodle (see below), using a browser or the Arbor student app.
- o **If your child does not know their log in for Arbor**, they can click the 'forgot your password' link to have instructions send to their school email address.

• Single sign on for Arbor

Seneca

Seneca is new to Ivanhoe this year and is a platform that allows homework to be set for student, and also allows students to access content to test and quiz themselves. Seneca for Key Stage 4 students


- o Students will have an email in their school inbox with details of how to log in. Simply follow the instructions to set up Seneca with the courses you are doing.
- We have paid for Seneca School Premium for all Key Stage 4 students, which allows them access to a range of content for revision, quizzing and self testing.

• Seneca for Key Stage 3 students

 Students in year 7, 8 and 9 will have received an email with a log in for Seneca. They have access to all of the basic features and may be set homework through Seneca.

• <u>Upgrading Seneca</u>

You or your child may see areas of the Seneca site that mention upgrading to Seneca
Premium as an individual. This allows access to more of the revision and quizzing features
and is personal choice – there is no requirement by the school for you to upgrade
and nothing set by school will require any paid features.





Moodle

Moodle is the schools VLE (Virtual Learning Environment). There is a link to Moodle on every school device, and the homepage will include links for Arbor, student emails, daily messages, and to curriculum resources for the subject your child studies. **Only students can access Moodle using their normal school email and password.**
