

PS16/COLLEGE/APPRENTICESHIPS

• You will start your applications for college and sixth form in the <u>next couple of weeks</u>.

Things to know -

- PS16 is used as the system for Leicestershire based colleges e.g. Ashby School, Loughborough College.
- You will apply directly to the college if it is outside of Leicestershire, e.g. Burton College and Derby College.
- Even if you are applying for a course outside of Leicestershire, **have a backup on PS16.**
- Our internal deadline for your applications to be in and finished is the 15th December.

Apprenticeships can be found on the government website and usually open for applicants in January.

You will start having college and sixth form **interviews** in **February**.

We will have 'mock interviews' here in school to get you prepared.



WHY IS ENGLISH AND MATHS SO IMPORTANT?

All qualifications are the key to opening the next door in your child's educational and career journey but none more so than **English and Maths. Grade 4** in both these subjects is a government minimum requirement – these are referred to as the 'basics measure.'



WHY ARE THE BASICS IMPORTANT?

- English and maths give essential numeracy and literacy skills for everyday life
- Employers at any stage of career look for a pass in English, including apprenticeships.
- If unsuccessful at school, you are required to retake either or both qualifications until you pass or turn 18 whatever careers path you take
- Some college courses will accept students without grade 4's but you are required to retake at college on top of your college course.
- The retake pass rate falls dramatically down to around 12% success you are far more likely to gain a grade 4 at school

Students, teachers and parents working together is the key to success




- 71% of Ivanhoe students with **over 96**% attendance gained their basic qualification last year





COURSE WORK REQUIREMENTS


ATTITUDE AND EFFORT ARE VITAL TO SUCCESS

- Just like exams course work is your chance to show what you can do independently
- · Coursework is as important as the exam
- Teachers cannot give direct feedback to students on what to do or how to improve
- Teachers **cannot mark coursework** and give you a result until it is complete and submitted to the exam board
- You need to assess your own progress using guides provided to you
- You must **do your very best first time** as there is no time to return to work later
- Parents can support course work by **keeping note of deadlines** and making sure their child is meeting them

WHERE ARE WE NOW?

Following up from Parents Evening


- From your parents evening discussions your 'Working At' grade should be getting closer to your predicted grade
- If not... what is your plan?



Target Grade – remains the same **Predicted Grade** – may change, but should be on or just below their target **WAG** – should be gradually increasing over time to get closer to prediction/target.

TIME TO START REVISING NOW

- Practice does not always make perfect, but it does make permanent.
- Students should have a bank of well practised revision and study methods that they can confidently select from.
- The core four revision techniques can form a basis for revision in most subjects. Your teachers will practice these techniques with you. Use them in combination to discover what works best for you.
