Drama		The performance of fictional or non-fictional narrative, events and characters for stage, film or radio.
Actor		Someone who pretends to be someone else while performing in a film, play, or television or radio programme.
Character		A person portrayed in a drama, novel, or other artistic piece. When you act the part of somebody else you are taking on a role. That role has personality traits, qualities and specific characteristics which form its character.
Audience		The group of people together in one place to watch or listen to a play, film or someone speaking.
Vocal Acting Skills		How an actor can change their voice to show their characters emotions and personality.
Pitch		High/Low
Pace		Fast/Slow
Tone		Express specific emotions e.g. happy or sad
Volume		Loud/Quiet
Projection		Throwing your voice so it travels to the back of the audience.
Physical Acting Skills		How an actor can change the way they move to show their characters emotions and personality.
Facial-expression		Changing your face to express emotion.
Body-language		Changing your body to express emotion.
Hand-gesture		Using your hands to express emotion.
